# Student emails

In the coming weeks all Grade 5 students will receive a @<u>woodlandsps.com</u> email address. This email address will allow students to send and receive emails from their peers, teachers, parents and others for educational purposes. The email accounts are run by Google so students will also have access to a range of Google Apps that will be used in the classroom.

\*\*\*It is very important to note that these accounts are for educational purposes only. **Students are not permitted to send personal emails.**\*\*\*

# <u>Homework</u>

This year, students are expected to complete 2.5 hours of reading. They are expected to write their reading in their reading log and return it every Friday ensuring they include the *date, duration of reading*, the *title* of their book and a *parent/guardian signature*. Students will also be given a list of 10 spelling words each week, which they will be tested on the following week. It is up to the students to learn these words. There will also be a section in their reading journal dedicated to revision of number facts (multiplication and division). Students are required to complete all sections to develop reading, spelling and numeracy skills throughout the year.

It is not compulsory, however students can complete tasks on Mathletics and Lexia to consolidate the learning that is going on in the classroom.

#### Maths Units – Place Value/Four Operations

In Term One, the students will be studying a unit on 'Place Value. They need to be able to recognise, represent and order numbers to at least hundreds of thousands and identify and describe factors of whole numbers. The students will also be looking at using estimation and rounding to check the reasonableness of their calculations. They will also develop the skills to use efficient mental and written strategies to solve mathematical problems.

In our 'Four Operations' unit, students will be working on solving problems involving multiplication of large numbers by oneor two- digit numbers. The will also look at solving problems involving division by a one digit number, including those that result in a remainder.

Please continue to encourage your child to learn/revise their times tables. A lack of knowledge in this area is holding some students back.

#### <u>English</u>

Term one in English will be extremely busy with the introduction of our new whole school spelling and grammar programme "Jolly Phonics/Grammar" and with necessary preparation for NAPLAN in term two. There will be specific focus on reading comprehension and writing; beginning with narratives and moving on to persuasives. We will all be studying class novels and complete in depth analysis of character, plot, vocabulary and sequence of events. Home reading is to be completed using good fit books which students source themselves either from school, local libraries or home. We encourage students to broaden their horizons and continue to search for books which inspire a love of reading. Please assist us by prompting plenty of discussion at home about what is read, spelling words and writing topics.

## **Inquiry**

This term, our inquiry unit is focussed on the topic of Geography. Student learning will be directed throughout the unit by the central idea and the key inquiry questions.

Central Idea - The environmental characteristics of Australia are influenced by human interactions and natural disasters.

#### Key Questions

- 1. What are the different environmental characteristics (features) of Australia?
- 2. What are the ways in which humans' impact on the environment?
- 3. What is the impact of bushfires and floods on communities and the environment?
- 4. What are the ways in which we respond to bushfires and floods and how can their impact be reduced?

As part of this unit students will participate in learning experiences to develop an understanding of the unique features of the Australian landscape and climate. They will explore how these features contribute to the natural disasters most commonly experienced in Australia. Students will also look at their own impact on the environment (positive and negative) and develop solutions to enhance these positive contributions and reduce the negative impacts on the environment.

## Wellbeing

This year we are continuing to run the "THRIVE" program, which focuses on student wellbeing. This program will run across the year, with a different theme each term. This term our theme is 'Enjoying Positive Emotions'. Students will be involved with lessons based on different concepts, including emotional literacy, recognising emotions and body language.
