SCHOOL PROCEDURES FOR THE BUSHFIRE SEASON

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.



Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter and via Compass. Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.

School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan, reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters].

What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and regularly checking Compass.

Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warning in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.

If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.




This was from our first introduction STEM lesson.
For an introduction to STEM the students discussed what's been happening to our wildlife in our country recently. There is a little friend Gumnut the koala living in the STEM room and students got to learn the effects of bushfires on our poor native animal and what amazing volunteers and organisations are doing to support and help these national treasures. LOST PROPERTY

As all parents would be aware lost property is a big issue at Woodlands with over 900 students. As a parent it is extremely frustrating, expensive and inconvenient when your child loses their belongings. There is no magic solution, however the P&F are investigating a tagging system which we will keep you posted on. In the meantime my class, 5W will be taking over lost property. This is what you need to know:

It is ESSENTIAL you LABEL all items that come to school. This way if found it will be returned to your child's classroom. I personally label my student's jumpers with a fabric paint on the inside of the neck so the label can't be cut off and I only use our surname so jumpers can be shared. YES I've still had my kids lose jumpers that haven't been returned so that isn't a solution but it definitely minimises it.

Any items found that are unnamed or unable to be returned (name illegible, students left the school etc.) will be hung on a rack outside room 27 from 8.45am and until approx. 4.00pm EVERY day for parents and students to look through. Please be mindful that you don't just take any jumper as this has a flow on effect. Anything left on this rack after a term will go to the second hand uniform shop.

Yes, there will be occasions where your jumper goes home with the wrong family and sometimes isn't returned, but there have been many times where this is accidental and they have been returned once parents notice when they do the washing. Sometimes this takes a week or more. There is nothing we can do to stop jumpers from getting into the wrong bags BUT if you label them well and if you return them to school as soon as you notice you have the wrong one this will minimise them permanently vanishing.

We will have two tubs outside Room 27 for students to drop in things that they "FIND." One will be for toys, lunchboxes etc. and the other for clothing. Anything of value (watches, jewellery etc.) will still go to the office for safe keeping. I will talk to the students at assembly and encourage them to leave things where they have been forgotten until the END of lunchtime as students often go back for their thing when the bell goes.

As you can imagine the task of sorting, returning locating etc. takes a lot of my time and effort so please be mindful of this fact if you don't get your things back immediately, I have a class full time and they are my number one priority when I am at school.

Any rubbish or food in lunchboxes will be thrown out immediately.

Thanks for your help and support. Please encourage your children to be responsible for their own belongings. If they take off a jumper during lunch or recess they should put them at their own classroom door or tie them around their waist. Don't bring anything to school that is Irreplaceable or too precious. Electronic toys should not be brought to school or taken outside.

IMPORTANT: CSEF Payments (Camps, Sports, Excursions Fund) PLEASE READ THE BELOW INFORMATION THOROGHLY AND CAREFULLY!

If you have a current heath care card you may be eligible for CSEF. This is \$125.00 for your child to use throughout the year on Camps, Sports or Excursions only.

* Parents who received CSEF in 2019 and have no new students attending this year or have no changes to their family circumstances you do not need to complete an application form in 2020, but will need to bring in your health care card for the office to copy for CSEF records. If you have had changes to your family circumstances or a new student start you will need to follow the process of a New Family (See below).

If a copy of your current card is not supplied to the office, your CSEF payment will not be processed.

- * New families to Woodlands Primary School. Will need to fill out the attached form (or collect one from the office). Then bring the form and health care card to the office. We will take a copy of your health care card and then process your application.
- *Current families who have recently received a health care card.
 Will need to follow the process of a New Family (Please see above).

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible" for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or,
- · on the first day of Term two.
- Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January 2020) or term two (14 April 2020).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Sumame, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 26 June, 2020.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.




