Woodlands Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of *our school's* voluntary financial contributions for 2022.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Extra-curricular items and activities are provided on a user-pays basis.

Ongoing and continued support from our families in regard to financial contributions to our school has ensured that our school can go above and beyond offering a standard curriculum program. This has made a huge difference to our school, academic achievements and the programs and support we can offer.

In addition to formal lessons in Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry, students benefit from access to a wide range of programs including THRIVE, Woodlands FM and Woodlands TV, swimming, choir, lunchtime clubs, camps, interschool sports, excursions, school-based activities and performances. The local community also enjoys the school's facilities with sporting groups holding training sessions before and after school. Working with our school council we have always ensured that school charges remain as low as possible.

As can be seen over the last few years, we have heavily invested in our school's facilities, teaching and learning program, student wellbeing programs and in our staff and students. Woodlands Primary School boasts functional, well maintained, attractive and well-equipped buildings that blend into the bush land setting. Many of the 38 classrooms can operate as open double rooms to enable staff to team-teach. All classrooms are well equipped with the necessary ICT resources, including a 1:1 laptop program in years 3 – 6, ensuring the development of these specific skills. Specialist facilities include a large Resource Centre that incorporates a computer lab and library, a Performing Arts Hall incorporating Music, Media, LOTE and Art rooms; a Stadium with a basketball court, change rooms, kitchen and STEM room; two synthetic sports fields and two outdoor basketball courts; an Intervention Centre, staff and administrative facilities. We continue to invest heavily in this area, believing that our students deserve the best possible opportunity to thrive.

Woodlands Primary School is an inclusive school where every child is supported and provided for. Your continued support through contributions, fundraising and volunteering has assisted us in creating a fantastic learning environment that is extremely well resources for our students.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
