Look at 2H's Sunflowers!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Thank you so much for supporting our school in these last few interrupted years of learning. This term, we are hosting a **Colour Explosion School Fun Run** to help us fundraise for updating our basketball area precinct. To achieve our goal, we aim to raise \$30,000 as a school community. Statement of Commitment to Child Safety

Woodlands Primary School is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making, with particular attention paid to the cultural safety of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with a disability and vulnerable children

Woodlands Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse and is committed to providing a child safe environment where children and young people are safe and feel safe, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives.

Every person involved in Woodlands Primary School has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role he/she plays individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.

In its planning, decision-making and operations, Woodlands Primary School will

- 1. Take a preventative, proactive and participatory approach to child safety
- 2. Value and empower children to participate in decisions which affect their lives
- 3. Foster a culture of openness that supports all persons to safely disclose risks of harm to children
- 4. Respect diversity in cultures and child rearing practices while keeping child safety paramount
- 5. Provide written guidance on appropriate conduct and behaviour towards children
- 6. Engage only the most suitable people to work with children and have high quality staff and volunteer supervision and professional development
- 7. Ensure children know who to talk with if they are worried or are feeling unsafe, and that they are comfortable and encouraged to raise such issues
- 8. Report suspected abuse, neglect or mistreatment promptly to the appropriate authorities
- 9. Share information appropriately and lawfully with other organisations where the safety and wellbeing of children is at risk
- 10. 10. Value the input of families and carers and correspond with them regularly.

Book Club

Dear Parents,

The best gift any parent can give a child is the love of books and the joy and benefits of independent reading for fun. Children who read at home, or are read to, have a head start on reading success in school.

Our school is participating in **Scholastic Book Club** this year. Up to twice a term, during the school year, students will bring home a Club catalogue with a different selection of books offered for all ages.

You'll find award-winning books and bestsellers, as well as old and new favourites. The books span a wide range of children's reading levels and interests and because they are inexpensive (some books cost as little as \$2).

It is easy to order. The **Book Club LOOP** platform for parents allows you to pay by credit card. Your child's order is submitted directly to Scholastic safe and sound and the books will be delivered to class. You can place your child's order at **scholastic.com.au/LOOP** or using the **LOOP** app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.

*Important note: NO MONEY will be accepted at school, ordering is only available through the LOOP.

Owning your own books is something special! Each order helps earn free books and teaching materials for our school, however, there is never any obligation to order. There is no better way to encourage reading than to allow children to choose the books they want to read. Brochures for Book Club will be sent home this week. Orders must be place through the LOOP and before the 16th March.

Dear Parents & Carers,

As a school community the safety and wellbeing of our students is always our main priority. With this in mind we wish to share the school's official position concerning student use of social media. The school has consulted with an eSafety Commissioner <u>Trusted eSafety Provider</u> to ensure we provide you with up to date and evidence-based advice.

All social media platforms (*including Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook, Discord and Tik Tok*) have a minimum age of 13 that is clearly outlined in the terms of service. Irrespective of the age rating mentioned in the App Store, 13 years is the mandated minimum age whether or not they have parental permission. For example, these are the terms of service directly from Instagram:

Who Can Use Instagram. We want our Service to be as open and inclusive as possible, but we also want it to be safe, secure, and in accordance with the law. So, we need you to commit to a few restrictions in order to be part of the Instagram community.

 You must be at least 13 years old or the minimum legal age in your country to use Instagram.

As a school we do not recommend any student under the age of 13 has access to their own social media account.

In addition to the age restriction, social media presents a myriad of issues related to the unsuitability of content (sexual references, language, drugs, alcohol and broader adult themes) on these platforms. These social media platforms have not been designed, managed or filtered with primary school age children in mind. The risks of cyberbullying and inappropriate messaging are increased when developing brains are presented with disappearing direct messages such as those featured in most social media. Another significant risk is the exposure to other users wishing to harm and abuse young people. The evidence is very clear that wherever young people gather online via social media platforms there will always be a risk of predators. We acknowledge that there is a time and a place for social media however these challenges of social media present much greater risk for primary school aged children.

Recommended: A messaging app that has been designed specifically for users under 13 is **Messenger Kids** (www.messengerkids.com). Parents require a Facebook account to manage and supervise their child's account. Using an app such as this provides a perfect opportunity for parents to introduce messaging and social media in a safer environment where open conversations can set up families for success down the track.

Further information about specific social media platforms, as well as games and apps, can be accessed via the parent <u>eSafety Guide</u> (Australian Government eSafety Commissioner).

In 2022 we are taking a proactive approach as a school. Students in F-6 will be participating in termly online safety incursions delivered by Inform & Empower. We are also supporting parents and carers in this space with Cyber Safety Tip Sheets each term following the student sessions.

2022 CSEF

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a **valid** means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2022 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years. Please note these activities will only take place if they meet COVIDSafe requirements.

HOW TO APPLY

FAMILIES WHO APPLIED LAST YEAR

- If you applied for CSEF through our school last year and have a Foundation child start this year, then you will need to fill out an application form and attach a copy of your Healthcare Card.
- If you applied for CSEF through our school last year and have no new children begin this year you will need to either email or bring in your Healthcare card to be copied.

FAMILIES WHO HAVE NEVER APPLIED AND ARE ELIGABLE

If you would like to apply for the first time, please either print the form attached to this post or come into the office to collect a hard copy.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office **as soon as possible.**



Vaccination Information from DET

It's been really fantastic to see such excitement around the return to school and we want to keep it that way. A crucial part of that is getting as many students vaccinated as possible.

Alongside ventilation and other vital COVIDSafe steps such as regular rapid antigen testing, supporting as many students as possible to be vaccinated will help make our school as safe as possible.

Bookings for children aged 5 to 11 to receive the paediatric Pfizer vaccine are open and we encourage parents and carers to get your child vaccinated, if you haven't already done so.

The <u>Pfizer vaccine is safe and recommended for children</u>. The vaccine will help protect your child from getting sick from COVID-19, help to reduce the spread of COVID-19, and help ensure kids can have more time at school and playing with their friends.

Vaccinations for children aged 5-11 years old are delivered at 2 appointments, 8 weeks apart. Children with specific medical vulnerabilities can access their second dose 3 weeks after their first dose.

Vaccination centres understand that children may feel anxious about vaccination or have other support needs. A range of options are available to help children get vaccinated. Please discuss your child's needs with the vaccination centre when you book an appointment.


