Polly Woodside

Today was the best day of school (: On Tuesday the 14th of June we visited the city for an amazing excursion. We went to Polly Woodside, a ship similar to the First Fleet, but not quite a First Fleet ship. Polly is a sail ship that was built in 1885. Polly travelled the sea for many years but just like the First Fleet ships she stopped for a couple of years and will not travel the seas again.

Once we got off the bus, it was about an hour's drive. We sat down on some stairs/steps and ate some snack. Once we all finished our snack we met our tour guides there were three; one for each group. We greeted our tour guides with AHOY as sailors would've said back in those days. Once we got our guides we went on the ship, one group at the front of the ship, one at the back and one in the museum (not on the ship). They told us some facts and one was, they named the ship after the captain's wife who passed away by the name of Polly.



Once all that had finished we climbed aboard the ship, our tour guide said that we needed to put our left foot on first or something bad would happen but of course some people put their right foot first and nothing happened. Just another one of those 'fairy tales'. Once we were all on the ship we went to the poop deck. Now of course it wasn't an actual poop deck it was where the steering wheel was. They used different words for left and right. The word for left was 'port' and right was 'starboard'. That's when she gave us some numbers one, two and three. Number two got a go at steering the wheel. The next job they did was scrubbing the deck while some people were scrubbing, the others were chanting 'SCRUB THE DECK'. But back then in those days nobody was chanting that. Sailors also got paid 30 pounds for 3 months of work, which about now would be worth \$60,000.



We went up to the front of the ship and number ones got to ring the bell. There were 4 words, each syllable was the amount of rings you did. For example if you ring the bell three times that word would be dead ahead (dead-a-head). We looked in the kitchen and sailors' cabins. We learnt that when the sailors felt sick they drank lemon juice and sometimes sucked on lemons. There were only eight beds in the sailors' cabins and sixteen sailors. So, eight sailors would've been working at night and eight would be sleeping and from now and then they would swap. We went down into the storage and the cook, navigator, first mate and of course the Captain's cabin. They looked all so different from the sailors' cabins and the Captain even had his own bath!!! Believe it or not there was a toilet for the sailors but all it was was a bucket and a disgusting poo rope which they wiped their bums with!



The last thing we did was explore the museum. We also watched a film about how all the sailors that were on this ship went about their lives on Polly Woodside and there was this barrel that made you feel like you were moving on a ship. As we were leaving we screamed AH HEY YA LATER which was aboy and see ya later mixed together.

This day was awesome. I will definitely come back - one day. We went back to school and we went out for lunch thinking about all the awesome things that just happened.

We then had an interesting challenge, there were images of things under a microscope and we had to guess what we thought it was. Who knew a banana looked like honeycomb under a microscope?!


This was really fun and we're all really glad Miss Hann was so kind to take some time off and teach us about microscopes and what they are able to do.














Winter Lightning Premiership


