2D'S AUSTRALIAN ENDANGERED ANIMALS!

As a part of our Term 3 Inquiry Unit on Sustainability, 2D have been learning about threatened or endangered species. We did some research about endangered Australian animals and worked really hard to create a piece of artwork based on our chosen animal. Everyone has worked so hard and produced something amazing!

Wild at Art

The students in 2H and 2D participated in the Wild at Art art competition run by the Australian Conservation Foundation. Students had to research a threatened species and create a piece of art based on their chosen animal or plant. The purpose of the competition was for young people to have a voice and raise awareness about threated or endangered Australian wildlife. The students had lots of fun creating their masterpieces and we all learnt so many new and interesting facts together. Here are just a few wonderful examples of our fantastic work.



I chose to learn about the Helmeted Honeyeater because they bring bright beautiful colours to nature with their brightly yellow pigmented feathers. However, they are critically endangered, which means there are not many in existence but there are some wildlife sanctuaries that are slowly bringing them back into the wild. Thanks to them, in March 2020 there were estimated to be at least 240 Helmeted Honeyeaters in the world.

My Wild Art picture is of the Orange Bellied Parrot. I chose the parrot to draw because of its cool colours. This small Australian parrot is critically endangered because its habitat is being destroyed by clearing, development and climate change. There are only about 50 left in the wild! These birds migrate from Tasmania to areas in Western Port where we live. It's amazing that they can fly so far! I hope we can save them. By Baylin 2H

<u>Tuesday to Friday 8.30 – 9.00 am 3.30 – 4.00 pm.</u> <u>This excludes Friday afternoon.</u>


Please enter via the outside back door of the library. Bags are to be left either outside if it is not raining or in the spaces provided inside the door.

They look fantastic, We love our 8 legged spiders.



2023 BACK TO SCHOOL PACKS - READY TO ORDER

With such a successful BTS process the last 2 years, we will once again be using KAKA Kids as our 2023 BTS supplier with the same ordering process.

We invite you to order your 2023 BTS packs directly through KA KA Kids via the website.

You will find attached to the Compass post, each year level itemised BTS list with instructions on how to order and a FAQ's document.

PLEASE NOTE:

 \cdot When ordering online, it will ask you for your address. This is a stipulation for the payment portal. However, your order will still be sent directly to the school.

Prior to ordering packs for 2023 Year 1 to 6 students online, you will need your child/ren's individual student ID (Not the family ID). This can be found by clicking on your child's photo in the <u>Compass app</u>. If you have a 2023
Foundation student, you will not need the student ID.

· Any orders placed after December the 16th will incur a fee of \$14.95

· Pack Items and quantities cannot be changed.


