State Team selection for Clara!

Woodlands' Clara Smith from 6G has recently returned from competing in the National State Championships of Netball for primary schools around Australia.

The championships were held in Wollongong NSW, where Clara and her Victorian teammates flew up for the week to play against all of the other states.

Clara was selected into a final squad of 12, which began with some local trials with students from neighbouring schools at Somerville Rec Centre. At this stage of the selection process, there were more than 300 students nominated by their schools across Victoria to showcase their skills and attempt to make the team. The next round of trials were held in Casey, where Clara was also successful in getting through, and managed to be invited for the final trial at the State Netball Centre in Parkville. This came down to the final 30 students in the state and Clara had obvious-ly been able to show the coaches how well she can play, as she was selected as a Goalkeeper in the final 12 to represent Team Vic!

At the tournament, the girls played 2 games each day for 5 days with a rest day in the middle. The tournament included Western Australia, Queensland, NSW, ACT, South Australia and Victoria. Team Vic managed to win against ACT both times, and also defeated Western Australia and South Australia once. These results meant that Team Vic finished 4th overall for the tournament, which is a great achievement.

On the rest day, all the girls from each state got together for a tree top walk which Clara said was lots of fun.

On behalf of the Woodlands community, we would like to congratulate Clara on such an outstanding sporting achievement. Everyone at Woodlands is so proud of you.

On the 27th of October all VHAP students had the opportunity to go to Twisted Science in Moorabbin. When we got there we went upstairs into this room called the Blue Lab which is where we put our bags and anything else we had on us. The staff then explained to us how the day was going to look and what we were doing.

After that we went next door into the lab where we had a class called 'Chemical Chaos.' We sat down on the floor whilst our instructor taught us about what chemicals are and how they react. After that she had a can with a hole on the bottom and a string attaching the can and the lid. She put what she called stripey gas in the can with a syringe, let it sit for a while and then through the hole put a lighter on and it EXPLODED! We then got our science gear on and had a go at making our own chemical gardens with a partner, which were made up of different elements to grow crystals. We also made a lot of other chemical compounds such as mixing metal and another acid to make it fizz up.

Following that, we then made our way back downstairs into the playzone. There were two sections, green and blue. We went into the green one first. The playzone was basically a big area filled with lots of different and interesting science activities. Some of them included colossal bubbles, sand sculpting, sound beam, pulley and balls, the gyroscope, and much more. There were also these rotating chairs, I think they almost got as much attention as the actual activities! Next was the blue playzone. This area had more interactive things such as airways, react, targets, tracer and hoops. At the back was this bedroom themed illusion room, where everything was upside down! We got some great group photos and everyone had a lot of fun and laughs.

It felt like the day had zoomed past and before we knew it, it was time to go home. Everyone had so much fun and wished they could stay for longer!

Prior to ordering packs for 2023 **Year 1 to 6 students** online, you will need your child/ren's individual student ID (Not the family ID). **This can be found by clicking on your child's photo in the <u>Compass app</u>.** If you have a 2023 Foundation student, you will **not** need the student ID.
