Elections of School Councillors for 2023

The Department of Education and Training has approved the commencement of the electoral process for the <u>elections of School Councillors for 2023</u>. Below is an outline of the process and a timeline for the completion of the elections. I have also included some information about the School Council, its membership establishment and role within our school.

Membership

Our School Council consists of 8 elected parent members, 4 elected members of staff, and the Principal, with two optional School Council appointed community members.

Terms of Office

The term of office is for two years.

Retiring School Councillors

The following members of the School Council retire at the end of this month. **Parents:** Lisa Meddings, Daniel Boyle, Will Sederino, Simon Maddock and Zac Critsilis Retiring members are eligible for re-election **Parent Positions Available:** 5 **Staff:** No staff retiring in 2023

Timeline for Elections

 Fri 10th Feb: Call for Nominations (Nomination box located at the office). Nomination forms can be collected from the Principal's office.
Fri 17th Feb: Nominations close 4:00 pm.
Mon 20th Feb: Nominations displayed at School. Election held if Required.
Mon 27th Feb: Close of Ballot and Votes counted.
Wed. 8th Mar: School Council AGM & School Council Meeting.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent category.

More than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school. 2

A mandated elected school employee category.

Members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of the school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional community member category.

Its members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be community members.

The term of office for members is two years. Half the members must retire each year and this creates vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Dear Parents & Carers,

In 2023 our students will be participating in the Inform & Empower digital safety & wellbeing program. This means that your child/children will be tuning in to live streamed incursions (with their teachers) every term that focus on healthy and safe digital habits. The incursion content is all written and delivered by qualified teachers who are endorsed by the eSafety Commissioner as a Trusted eSafety Provider.



These sessions aim to help children better navigate the online BRAVE world and become more aware, clever brave and kind. They will focus on topics

including navigating unwanted contact, cyberbullying, help-seeking strategies, unsafe content, balancing screen time with "green time" and sharing personal information. W Foundation (Kinder/Prep) students do not on. While participate in live streamed sessions, they will be exploring the basics of the online world through guided activities.



You, the parents and carers, will also be given resources to support conversations with your children at home. You will receive a concise "tip sheet" each term that outlines what your child learned about in class and how you might open up these important conversations.

Student Surveys

Years 3-6, Inform & Empower will invite students to complete anonymous surveys asking them about their digital habits. No identifying information, such as name or school, is collected. This survey is optional. You or your child may choose to opt out at any stage. please inform the school if you do not wish your child to complete these surveys. Questions examples include: What online games do you like to play? How many hours do you spend online each day/week? What are the best/worst things about the internet? The survey data will be used by Inform and Empower to help improve their programs and may be published online.

As a school, participation in this digital safety and wellbeing program forms part of our ongoing commitment to child safety
