## **ATTENDANCE**

As we settle into the new school year, I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize the importance of attending primary school regularly and the impact of missed school days.

Every day in school is important for your child's academic and social development. Each lesson builds on the previous one, and missing even a single day can put your child behind. In fact, research shows that students who miss just 10% of the school year (or about 18 days) are more likely to fall behind in their studies and have lower test scores. Long term evidence suggests that attendance is a key factor in determining academic success and graduation rates.

You may have noticed more communication from the school regarding your child's absences. Minimising student absences is a Woodlands and Department of education goal in 2023. Even just one absence a fortnight adds up to 20 days per year, 140 days in primary school and 260 days from Foundation to Year 12. This equates to more than a year of missed school days.

We understand that sometimes absences are unavoidable due to illness or family emergencies, and we encourage you to keep your child home in those situations. However, we ask that you make every effort to schedule doctor's appointments and other activities outside of school hours to ensure that your child does not miss valuable classroom time. Always upload your child's absence on Compass the night before or the morning of their absence.

In addition to the academic impact, regular attendance is important for building good habits and developing social skills. When students miss school, they miss out on opportunities to interact with their peers and learn important social skills like teamwork and communication.

We appreciate your partnership in ensuring your child attends primary school regularly and on time. Let's work together to help your child succeed academically and socially.

**Elections of School Councillors for 2023** 

The Department of Education and Training has approved the commencement of the

electoral process for the elections of School Councillors for 2023. Below is an outline of

the process and a timeline for the completion of the elections. I have also included some

information about the School Council, its membership establishment and role within our

school.

Membership

Our School Council consists of 8 elected parent members, 4 elected members of staff, and

the Principal, with two optional School Council appointed community members.

**Terms of Office** 

The term of office is for two years.

**Retiring School Councillors**

#### What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

#### Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

#### A mandated elected parent category.

More than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school. 2

#### A mandated elected school employee category.

Members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of the school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

#### An optional community member category.

Its members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be community members.

The term of office for members is two years. Half the members must retire each year and this creates vacancies for the annual school council elections.

# LIVE STREAMED INCURSIONS

Dear Parents & Carers.

In 2023 our students will be participating in the Inform & Empower digital safety & wellbeing program. This means that your child/children will be tuning in to live streamed incursions (with their teachers) every term that focus on healthy and safe digital habits. The incursion content is all written and delivered by qualified teachers who are endorsed by the eSafety Commissioner as a Trusted eSafety Provider.



These sessions aim to help children better navigate the online world and become more aware, clever, brave and kind. They will focus on topics



including navigating unwanted contact, cyberbullying, help-seeking strategies, unsafe content, balancing screen time with "green time" and sharing personal information. While Foundation (Kinder/Prep) students do not participate in live streamed sessions, they will be exploring the basics of the online world through guided activities.



You, the parents and carers, will also be given resources to support conversations with your children at home. You will receive a concise "tip sheet" each term that outlines what your child learned about in class and how you might open up these important conversations.

#### **Student Surveys**

In Years 3-6, Inform & Empower will invite students to complete anonymous surveys asking them about their digital habits. **No identifying information, such as name or school, is collected.** This survey is **optional**. You or your child may choose to opt out at any stage, please inform the school if you do not wish your child to complete these surveys. Questions examples include: What online games do you like to play? How many hours do you spend online each day/week? What are the best/worst things about the internet? The survey data will be used by Inform and Empower to help improve their programs and may be published online.

As a school, participation in this digital safety and wellbeing program forms part of our ongoing commitment to child safety.
